1 Million Visitors

Our CEO set the goal of our branches recording **1M** visits in 2025. Challenge accepted and won by the third week in December 2025. The lucky “swiper” was from our Green Family YMCA.

Kids Y-Tri – Year One!

Our Wadsworth branch initiated a new event for **youth** where they participated in three events back-to-back: Running, Swimming and Biking. The first-ever youth triathlon, for our Association, gained the participation of 60 athletes - with big plans to expand the event in 2026.



Racing Through 2025

Three of our branches hosted their most successful 5K events in 2025. Kohl Family YMCA invited four-legged friends to their P.S. I Love You race, while Firestone Park re-routed their Tread Together event at the Bridgestone Test Tire Track. Meanwhile, Green Family YMCA gobbled up the goods by assisting with the long-standing Green Turkey Trot on Thanksgiving morning – an event that they will totally run in 2026.



Neighborhood Back-to-School

Our Firestone Park branch was the catalyst and cornerstone of an inspiring community event centered on giving neighborhood students a good start to the school year. While partnering with the Firestone Park Community Center, and area businesses, the team was able to provide school supplies, clothing, healthy snacks, and useful information, including a financial literacy workshop, free bus passes, and discounted memberships to Sam's Club for parents.

Green Celebrates 25 Years

One of the first additions to the newly formed City of Green was the creation of the Green Family YMCA. Set as the cornerstone of the community, the Green Y soon became central to activities and partnerships involving the City and its residents. In 2025, the Y celebrated a quarter-century of success by holding an anniversary celebration preceded, a few months prior, with their first ever Quarter Auction, to play up the theme and earn dollars for continued improvements to the branch.



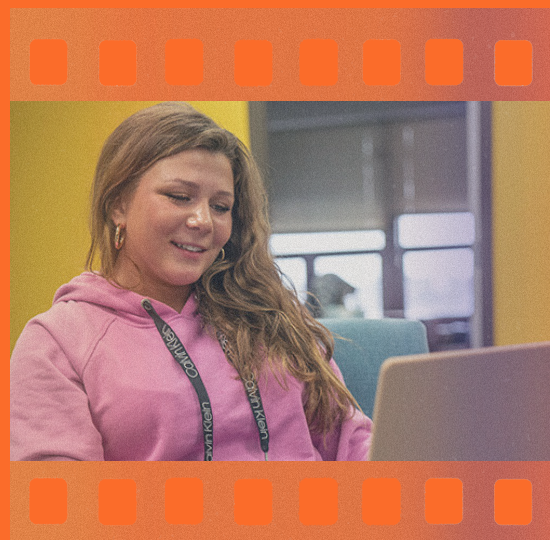
Students Get a Break

Our partnership with the University of Akron continued in 2025. College students, currently enrolled and caring for their families, received a significant break in child care costs. The University, through a partnership with the Akron Area YMCA, subsidized 75% of the child care tuition for these student parents.



Camp Y-Noah Turns 95

From its first summer in June 1930, serving over 800 boys, Camp Y-Noah has expanded to over 300 acres and the ability to welcome girls, community groups, and alumni to enjoy the lake, equestrian center, and a brand-new and energy-efficient wastewater treatment operation. In 2025, Camp Y-Noah welcomed 7,653 friends through staple programs including Day Camp, Overnight Camp, Outdoor Ed, and a year-round Equestrian program.

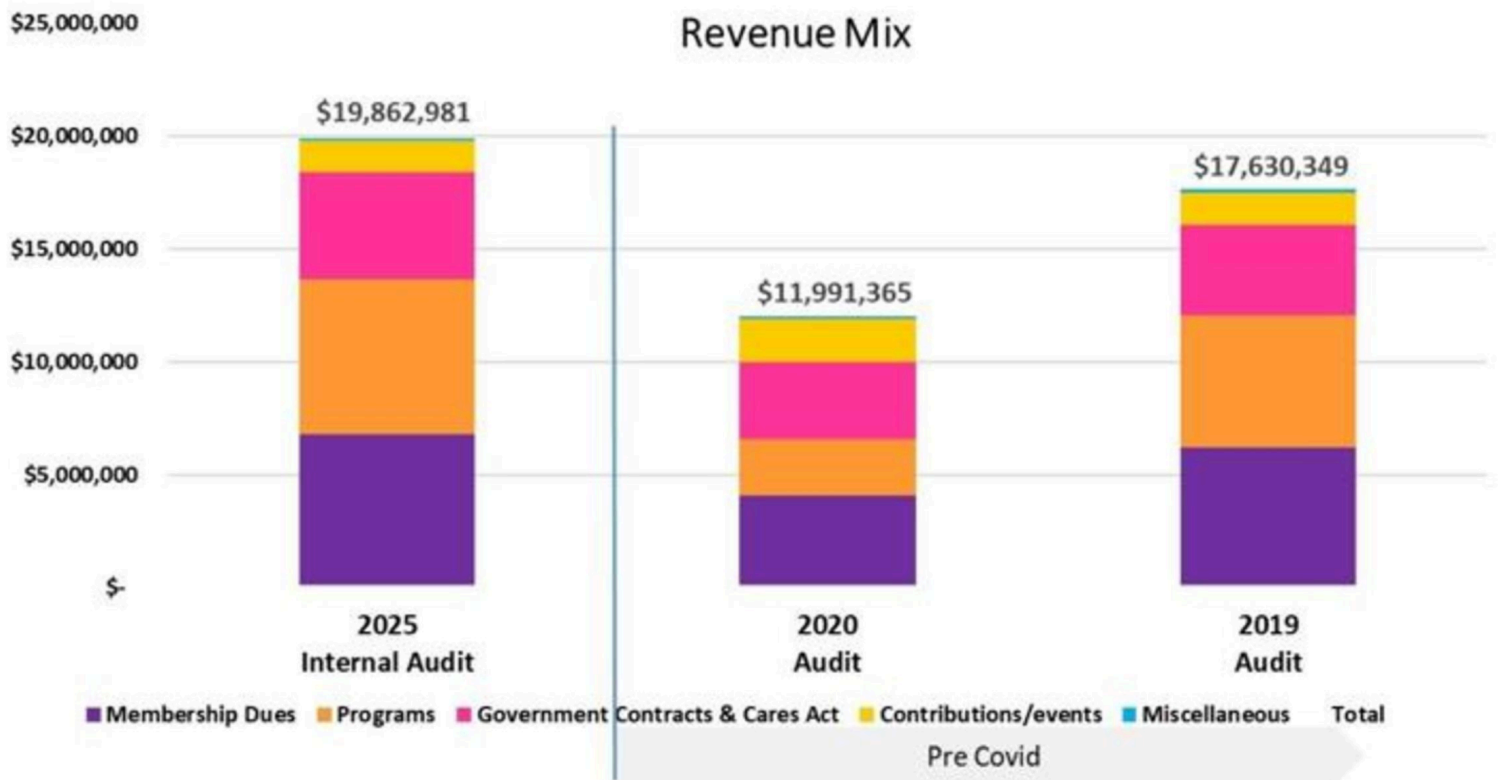

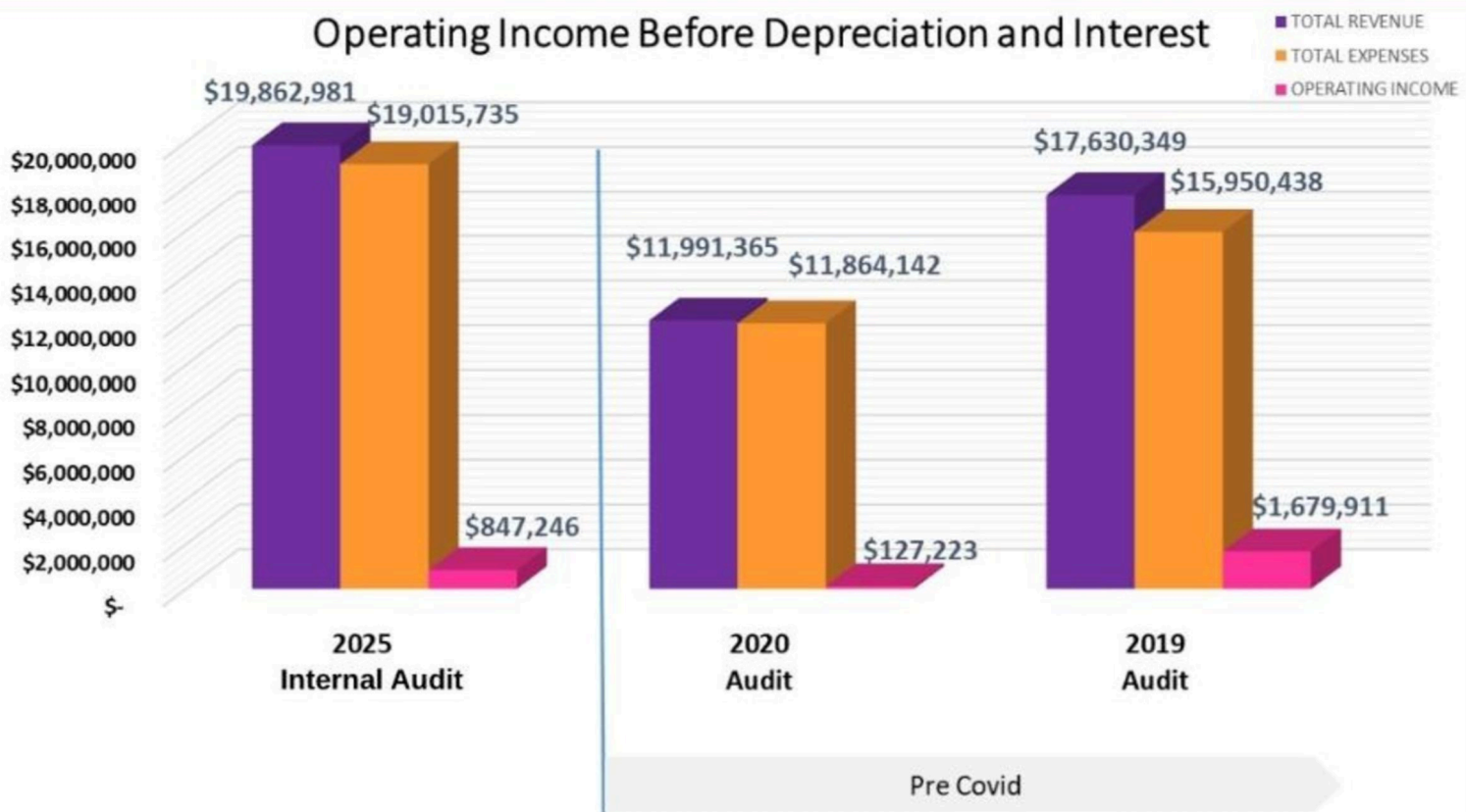
Financial Picture for REVENUE



2025 Growth in Membership and Programming has replaced our reliance on pandemic government relief, creating a balanced income stream: **35% Programs, 34% Membership, and 31% Fundraising/Grants.**"

While our revenue has shown resilient growth of **11.2% over pre-pandemic levels**, we are navigating a fundamental shift in our industry's economics. Pandemic-related disruptions have left a **permanently higher cost base**, with expenses rising **16%** over the same period—outpacing our top-line growth."
